As readers...

We will be identifying areas for development through reading assessments and will practise these during both whole class and 1:1 reading sessions. This will include extracting information from texts, explaining how texts, characters and events make us feel, retelling what we've read with detail, predicting what might happen and making deductions about what we've read.

As writers...

We have a focus on classic poetry to start the term, looking at 'The Highwayman' (KF) and 'The Listeners'(F). We will create our own stories based on these, including character descriptions and a re-telling from another perspective. We will then learn how to write a biography, including a focus on formal language, cohesive devices and parenthesis / embedded clauses.

As linguists... we will be practising vocabulary linked to transport including new verbs, places and prepositions. We will also work on vocabulary linked to Christmas, including French traditions.

As mathematicians... Falcons will begin the term learning prime, square and cube numbers. They will understand how to multiply and divide all numbers by multiples of 10 and practise methods of multiplication. After this, they will have a fraction unit and learn equivalence, how to convert them, order and compare them and how to add / subtract fractions. Kingfishers will start the term learning how to solve multi-step word problems and looking at the order of operations. They will then move on to a fraction unit focused on equivalence, simplifying, converting, adding/subtracting and solving word problems based on them.

As geographers...

we will be finding out about the Earth's climate and areas of extreme temperature. We will also look at:

- the water cycle
- extreme weather conditions
- tsunamis and what causes them
- longitude and latitude
- equator, hemisphere, tropics and poles

we will be learning about Christianity and asking the question 'What does Christmas mean to Christians?' We will also look at how Christmas is celebrated around the world.
